

Our Synod at Work

Southeastern Synod Assembly 5/31 to 6/2/24

The congregation selected Nancy and I to be the voting representatives at the Synod assembly. We had never attended an assembly before and were not sure what we would contribute or learn from the experience. We had an awakening.

The Friday night speaker, Bryan Stevenson, was very impactful. His perspective on the prison system, racism and unfair justice meted out, particularly in the South, was eye-opening. When we watched the film of his story, "Just Mercy", in our break-out group, it confirmed the inequality and injustice.

The three worship services were wonderful. Nancy loved the Saturday service that included the choir, liturgical dancers, and ministers. It was full of energy, led by the young people of the ELCA.

On a sad note, despite the efforts of inclusion, some of our ELCA members are turned away by their families because of their sexual orientation. It opened our eyes to the struggles of the LGBTQ community. I cannot imagine turning my back on any of our five children because of their lifestyle. We are thankful that these members have found a haven in their church family, that they could not find in their own families.

We also were proud to see the amount of volunteer support from our St. Matthew family at the assembly. We should be proud of the efforts of all the volunteers. Plus, we thought Pastor Taylor with his neon vest did an excellent job as chairperson for the election voting.

We hope everyone will consider volunteering for the 2025 Synod which will return to Columbus in late May.


