Our experience of this is reflected in Paul's words today. When we pray to God as Jesus prayed to the Father (an everyday, intimate parental address), the Spirit prays within us, creating between us and God the same relationship Jesus has with the One who sent him.

But of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit one is the divinity, equal is the glory, co-eternal is the majesty.

What the Father is, thus the Son is, [and] thus the Holy Spirit.

Uncreated is the Father; uncreated is the Son; uncreated is the Spirit.

Immeasurable is the Father; immeasurable is the Son; immeasurable is the Holy Spirit.

Eternal is the Father; eternal is the Son; eternal is the Holy Spirit.

And yet there are not three Eternals, but One who is eternal;
Just as there are not three uncreated ones, nor three immeasurable ones, but one who is uncreated and one who is immeasurable.

Similarly, almighty is the Father; almighty is the Son; almighty is the Holy Spirit: And yet there are not three Almighties, but One almighty.

Thus the Father is God; the Son is God; the Holy Spirit is God; and yet there are not three Gods, but God is one.

Thus the Father is Lord; the Son is Lord; the Holy Spirit is Lord: And yet there are not three lords, but the Lord is One.

As by Christian truth we are compelled to acknowledge each distinct person as God and Lord, so by catholic religion we are forbidden to say that there are three gods or lords.

The Father is by no means made nor created nor begotten.

But it is necessary for eternal salvation that one also faithfully believe the incarnation of our Lord Jesus Christ.

For this is the right faith:
that we [should] believe and confess,
that our Lord Jesus Christ, God's Son,
is God and human.
He is God from the being of the Father,
begotten before the ages;
And he is human from the being of [his] mother,
born in [this] age.
Fully God, fully human,
comprised of a thinking soul and human flesh.
[He is] equal to the Father in respect to divinity,
less than to the Father in respect to humanity.

Who, although he be God and human, is not thereby two [Christs], but one Christ.

He is one [Christ] not by the changing of the divinity into flesh, but by the assumption of the humanity into God. He is in every way one, not by a confusion of being, but by a unity of person.

For as the rational soul and flesh are one human, so also [the] God-and-human is one Christ:

Who suffered for our salvation; descended into the realms below, on the third day resurrected from the dead. He ascended into heaven, sits at the right hand of God the Father Almighty: thence he will come to judge the living and the dead.

At his coming all people have to rise again

in their own bodies and they are to provide an account concerning their own deeds.

And those who have done what is good will go into eternal life; those [who have done what is] truly evil into eternal fire.
